■ **2018 ICC BANKING COMMISSION ANNUAL MEETING**

Adopting the theme “Navigating Trade in a World of Disruption”, the ICC held its Annual Meeting in Miami. Plenary sessions confronted prevailing conditions impacting global trade finance amid an era of uncertainty by reflecting on industry trends and pondering the future prospects for trade. Breakout sessions focused on the changing perception of risk, disruptive technology, and global developments motivating new initiatives. Typical for any Banking Commission meeting, time was allocated for briefings on ICC rules and analysis of ICC draft opinions. Attention was also directed at supply chain finance solutions and how they are transforming open account trade for corporates. *DCW*’s summary report of the meeting is featured here followed by an interview with supply chain finance specialist Jonathan Richman.
